Abstract: Personality is the part of us that sets us apart from others. In studying a personality, there are theories discussing the nature of every human being's personality, known as psychoanalysis theory. Psychoanalysis consists of three elements, namely ID, EGO, and SUPEREGO. These personalities are interconnected and create human behavior. The aims of this research are to find out Kat's personality based on the Id, Ego, and Superego theory and to find out the most dominant personality in Kat Stratford's character according to Sigmund Freud's theory. This research uses a qualitative method. The data source is taken from scenes and dialogues in the 10 Things I Hate About You movie and focused on analyzing the Id, Ego, and Superego in Kat Stratford's character. The results of the analysis show that there are 16 data points for Id, 10 for Ego, and 3 for Superego, and the most dominant personality in Kat Stratford's character is Id, with 16 data points.

According to Sigmund Freud's theory, the Superego is a personality form from the subconscious that does what is right and what is wrong, such as commands, advice, criticisms, or suggestions that contain norms and rules that apply in society.

CONCLUSION

From this research, according to Sigmund Freud, every human being has 3 personality elements, namely ID, EGO, and SUPEREGO. The Id is based on the "pleasure principle," which basically implies

that the Id wants whatever feels good without considering what might happen in the future. The Ego was based on the "reality principle." The Ego learns that there are other individuals who have wants and needs. And the last one is Superego. The superego is the part of our psyche that determines what is right and what is bad.

Based on the analysis above, it can be concluded that the researcher used the 10 Things I Hate About You movie scenes and dialogues as data sources, by using Kat's character as the object. The researcher found that there are three types of personality in Kat's character, namely, Id with 16 data, Ego with 10 data, and Superego with 3 data.
